# **DPAC Report (Erin Schwarz)**

 Presentation from Maple Ridge Transportation Advisory Committee: Jenny Wright, Gary Hare and Pascal Shaw About Active School Travel (AST) (Walking, cycling..) and School Travel Planning (STP) (Community based approach leading to increased rates of AST). Promoting and supporting active transportation in Maple Ridge.

Committee makes recommendations to council in regards to transportation initiatives. School Travel Planning is a process through which school and regional stakeholders work together to create and implement an action plan to each school or group of schools. Can inquire if any school travel planning projects are underway or in place in MR schools. Benefits of AST – healthier children, less traffic and pollution, safe school zones

Travel <a href="https://mapleridge.ca/234/Safer-School-Travel">https://mapleridge.ca/234/Safer-School-Travel</a> Can lead to discussion like bike security – bike lockers – funding may be available; need assessment done to find barriers, sight lines under district maintenance, help with safe route maps for walking

- Sylvia Russell (Superintendent) discussed presentation from nov 19<sup>th</sup> to board chairs/superintendents given by Dr Reka Gustafson – Deputy Prov Health Officer to give perspective of COVID in schools. 549 active COVID exposures (students and staff) – 12 in school transmissions otherwise community/home transmissions
- COVID has affected 14 school districts. 83% of provincial schools have no COVID. 600,000 students in BC (70,000 staff)

- 4x less likely to have COVID in school than in any other event (community at large). Home or unstructured indoor settings is where transmission is occurring.
- Fairview Elementary was closed due to vandalism will be re-opening November 24<sup>th</sup>
- COVID exposure notification letters have been sent to Albion, SRT, Golden Ears, Yennadon, and Thomas Haney.

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 Still no hot lunches at this time. No visitors except essential.
