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Review & Acceptance of Agenda

Administration Reports

Principal's Report

- Emergency drill- there were about 50 people who had not filled out forms, but there were only about 20 people left at 2:20pm. The afternoon went orderly and smoothly. Feedback to the district was that we could improve signage, and consider an alternate plan for any kids or parentsshin with mobility challenges. We may not do annually, but it may be considered every second year.
- Feedback from the community is that there is a lot of positive things going on in the school, and lots of ways to participate.
- Halloween dances went well, with all intermediates participating. The Halloween family dance went really well too, and decorations were appreciated.
- Remembrance Day assemblies went well, and students participated and were respectful
- Quebec trip is in preparation, and many field trips are being planned in classrooms
- Christmas concerts- the staff took a long time to consider, and in order to accommodate the evening performance the concert is going to be primary only. The intermediates do not show the same passion for the concert. For intermediates who would really love to participate, there may be some options to help buddy classes.
- Beautification of school: the school has contacted Jason Craft and beautification of the lobby through the library and to the student entrances is the goal for next summer. We are considering asking for student input and design- what is Pitt Meadows to you? We have approximately \$10000 toward the project, and closer to summer we can check the budget.

Chair Report (chaired by Luba King)

- Playground update- the funding is in place, the committee sat down with the district in September to address any concerns. The district asked that we get quotes for the labor/construction of the playground equipment and rubber ground installation. We have got the quotes, and we have submitted to the district. The timeline will fall into place when we: 1. Have approval from the district (so that contracts can be signed and purchases can be confirmed); and 2. know when the rubber matting is available for delivery. Tentatively, we are scheduled for spring break installation and construction.
- Grade 7 Leaving Committee- will be formed in the spring when the kids have discussed what the day will look like.
- Theatrix- first run will be Jan 21-Feb 27; we will start with primaries (no Quebec conflict)
