Review & Acceptance of Agenda

### **Administration Reports**

#### **Trustee Report**

- Welcome to Sarah Nelson and Eleanor Palace from the school board office
- There are 7 trustees; Sarah and Eleanor are the 2 designated to Pitt Meadows. Their goals are to work cooperatively with groups throughout the district to focus on educational objectives and make it student-centered.
- Trying to find a way to connect more with communities and communicate more with interest groups (CUPE, BCPVPA, and Maple Ridge groups). The board has created a roadmap for success, with policies including a policy to prioritize safe, caring, and healthy schools.
- Trustees and board are receptive to innovative ideas, including: the "Wheelhouse" where students go out several times a week to observe and work with the community; the environmental school with Flex 42 to transition elementary to secondary; parent portal with online registration.
- School board is the conduit between provincial government and local communities. Trustees meet every 2 weeks; and all trustees belong to committees. BCPSEA and BCSTA are two groups that the trustees belong to, and offer sessions for trustees to learn and grow. In addition, trustees belong to community groups and visit schools.
- Trustees are (the last) resort for school based issues, but they are there as a resource. Trustees are also a resource for budget-based issues.
- In Pitt Meadows, the projection is that the population will grow due to influx of elderly rather than young families. Therefore, new schools are not projected. Enrolment projections do not show large growth

for some time. However, there are pockets of growth although district wide we are not growing. Catchment lines can change to try and address these pockets, but no schools can be added until district enrolment is at 110%.

- Budget: there has been and still exists a budget shortfall. The projection is that the district will need to cut 44 positions. There is an online survey and a public meeting tomorrow to address budget issues. The district board is willing to look at change within 3 criteria: change needs to be made with students in mind, evidence-based and sustainable, made with cooperation with all participants.
- Our district is among the highest in the province with respect to gradrates (#2 in BC). We have moved from 76.3% in 2008 to 90.7% in 2012.
- We are in the process of hiring a new superintendent, but the new hire will not be in place until June.

## Principal's Report

- Welcome back to Nicole Neggers, filling in as Principal, and thank you to Sara Campbell for staying on as VP
- Thank you for everyone's patience, understanding and flexibility with respect to the plumbing issues. The school tried to get the message out quickly, and only about 20 students showed up at the beginning of the school day. The district did everything that they could to keep the school open, but it was too big a job, and the resulting cleanup. Request to add willing daycares to be added to emergency/school closure list so that they can prepare for emergencies.
- We had a lockdown drill on Monday morning that went very well. In the rooms with a lot of windows, the position of children needs to be slightly adjusted, but all kids and staff worked well to make sure that classrooms looked empty. If there was an emergency in the school while kids are out, the meeting place will be the Rec Center, with teacher guidance.
- Firedrills- we need 6 by year end, and we have had 5 successful drills.
- The net-climber (aka. Spider web) is beginning to fray. There is wire woven into the rope, so duct tape has been added. There is no warranty on that piece of equipment. Repair of this climber can be done for \$5800; we will look into the price of a new piece of equipment. A new piece of equipment may be eligible for a grant whereas repairs are not. Whatever decision is made, needs to be made soon. The budget can withstand \$8000 toward playground. Playground fundraising can be done in gaming and eligible for grants. Liaising with daycares (Colleen), businesses (Sonja)...

Motion to support replacement/repair of web for up to \$7000, with effort to reduce the amount through fundraising. Any financial decision will be made in collaboration with PAC Executive. Seconded by Sonja Fletcher. Nine in favor, One opposed.

- Buses and classroom allowances are up to \$5000. Teachers have not been submitting receipts, but Nicole will remind them.
- Mother's Day/Father's Day- we will take a break from muffins for moms and donuts for dads due to financial concerns, family status, primary vs. intermediate participation. Teachers will do an activity, left to their discretion, and decorations will be made for the halls around these events. Want to encourage adults to come into school. An art show with classroom galleries will be presented to try and encourage all families to participate. Fundraising event possible, especially with the need of a new climbing structure. Event will be held June 13 at the end of the day-1-2pm.
- Track and Field and Cross Country is up and running. Cross country practices are during the school day. All primaries will run in the morning, and intermediates will go out before lunch, and those participating will need to fill out permission forms.
- Speeches- English speech competition will not be attended by PME this year.

- Reporting for the 3<sup>rd</sup> term is not a conference, it will be a written report. It will look different that years past.
- Parent Portal- all field trips need to go out by portal. Newsletters go out via portal, but they will also go out by email from now on.
- Quebec exchange- 37 students from Quebec will come April 30 (they are grade 7's from high school). Planned trips to Camp Jubilee, Wild Play, Aquarium, Whistler, day with Ross Davies.
- Mural- Jason Craft will meet with admin, 6 teachers, and Lisa. Jason will start by end of year (May/June). Students from each class will be invited to participate.
- Suspicious person was on site, so teachers will be concerned about safety and may have doors locked.
- Principal appointment is still in the air, we may know by mid-May
- Sound system still needs to be looked at, Nicole will be in contact with the district
- Pie in the Eye fundraiser planned for May to raise money for the Ride to Conquer Cancer, May 23 is pie throwing day

- Will apply for cakewalk/raffle basket prize
- Budget will be adjusted to reflect playground
- Operating budget still has items unresolved, but expect to pay them out by June
- \$280 earned on movie night
- $\circ$  Currently there is \$17982 in Operating, and \$9195 in Gaming
