Administration Reports

Principal's Report

- Emergency Plan and prep- the long-term plan (by next June) is to have a district plan in place. The district will put the bin on-site by the end of August, and the administration will have say as to where the bin will be placed. Consideration will be given to the sightlines for play time. The lock on the bin is strong, but no insurance information has been provided.
 - As for stocking the bin, the district is unable to give a specific list as to what they can/will provide and guidelines as to the quality and quantity of goods included; the district focus has been on personnel and communication tools. Schools have different starting points and different funds available. Priorities to consider would be shelter and water.
 - The district emergency procedures have been detailed further this year, and consistency should be increased among schools as a result. By September, the information from the district should be ready to share via the website and newsletters.
 - Luba will bring up emergency planning as a DPAC item at the meeting on Thursday.
